- A. WHY? Main purpose of licensure to protect the public
 - a. Must be a demonstrated need based on past cases or future concerns
 - b. Incompetence / Practicing beyond area of competence
 - c. If not a strongly demonstrated need, the profession must initiate, coordinate and lead the charge
 - d. Not interested in status or turf
 - e. Which voice does the Board listen to from the profession?
 - i. Board members' own professional work experience and prof associations
 - ii. NSPE, NCSEA, ASCE, ACEC, AIA
- B. WHY HERE? Specific State Board issues
 - a. Make-up of the board (number of engineers, other professions)
 - b. Language in Statutes and Rules where and how does it fit?
 - c. Neighboring states & comity
 - Specific industries or organizations w/in the state that would be affected (DOT, RR, towers, and the strength of their voice)
- C. WHY NOT? Board obstacles
 - a. Vulnerability of opening up the statute to legislators
 - b. Picking legislative battles
 - c. Extra work for Board Staff
 - i. Evaluating and processing applications
 - ii. Fielding questions
 - iii. More complaints filed
 - d. Extra work for Board Members
 - i. Approving technical qualifications
 - ii. More complaints to evaluate

D. HOW?

- a. Dialogue with the Board about the perceived need
- b. Provide similar language from other states and NCEES
- c. Do the leg work with other engineering organizations & industries to present a unified voice
- d. Provide solutions to perceived obstacles
- e. Be patient
